ABC Ranks Thinned on Arlington Board

The Arlington County Board, in a series of partisan votes, appointed an independent and a Democrat and reappointed a member of the nonpartisan Arlingtonians for a Better County to the five-man School Board last night.

Dr. John R. Spicer, 60, an administrator for the Central Intelligence Agency, was appointed to a second four-year term. The new appointees, whose terms begin July 1, are:

• William M. Graham, 44,

chairman of the Arlington Civic Federation and a past chairman of the County Democratic Committee.

• Dr. Ernest E. Saulmon, 54, director of the Animal Health Division of the Agriculture Department's agricultural research service, who served this year as chairman of the Citizens Action Committee for the Thomas Jefferson area appointed by the School Board.

Their appointments were secured by the votes of the County Board's majority coalition composed of Thomas W.

Richards of the ABC and independent Board members Joseph L. Fisher and Jay E. Ricks.

The County Board's two Republicans, Dr. Kenneth M. Haggerty and Ned R. Thomas, failed in attempts to appoint their own choices—attorney Henry St. John FitzGerald, accountant Franklin Harding and civil engineer George Cook.

The political complexion of the School Board has changed considerably since January, when all five of its members belonged to the ABC. Now only Spicer and Mrs. Ruth

O'Dell Cox are directly affiliated with the non-partisan group.

The Republicans, who have long criticized their lack of representation on the body, are still dissatisfied with its makeup. The first Republican, builder Preston Caruthers, was appointed to the School Board in February by the County Board's majority coalition, but the Republicans objected they had no say in the choice.
